guidance notes for the ice conditions of contract for archaeological investigation

editor william k macdonald presents several essays on contract archaeology or archaeological work done by companies or agencies on sites that typically are about to be destroyed by construction thomas j riley reports on contract archaeology and the academic world james e fitting writes from the perspective of a state archaeologist macdonald and alex h townsend report on problems in corporate archaeology townsend writes about how contracts are acquired and steven a leblanc reports on the need for regions to have an overall research design and to follow best practices in hiring technological improvements and storage

an archaeological investigation is usually undertaken to provide information in response to a proposed development which could cause damage to archaeological remains as part of the planning process within the framework of appropriate national planning policy guidance notes and or development plan policy as part of an environmental impact assessment in connection with management plans and mitigation strategies of private local and national or international bodies outside the planning process e g infrastructure projects ecclesiastical development coastal erosion agriculture forestry and countryside management works by public utilities and statutory undertakers where the investigation finds archaeological remains they are recorded analysed and interpreted and the findings disseminated as appropriate these conditions of contract the first of its kind regulate the business relationship between the employer and the specialist archaeological contractor during the course of an archaeological investigation the contract retains a pattern traditional in civil engineering contracts with an investigation commissioned by an employer landowners developers etc designed or approved by an engineer and carried out by a specialist archaeological contractor only that the term consultant is used instead of engineer its advantages include providing parties to the contract with and advanced warning of circumstances that may give rise to

additional costs or delay or which may warrant a significant change to the scope of the investigation enabling the minimisation of additional cost and or delay as well as potential for dispute minimising the incidence of disputes and resolving those that may arise in a speedy and non confrontational manner on that basis that many archaeological contracts will fall within the provisions of part 2 of the housing grants construction and regeneration act 1996 this contract has been drafted to comply with the legislation with the intention that the various statutory schemes for construction contracts should not apply

quality management in archaeology deals with the effects of the profound changes that have had an impact on the discipline of archaeology all over the world in north america in europe and increasingly in other parts of the world new legislation and international treaties have changed its position in society what was once a university based research activity by a limited number of academics has become a socially relevant field with many practitioners that are mostly employed in some branch of archaeological resource management archaeology has been successful in persuading governments and the general public that more should be done to preserve archaeological heritage and to investigate it where it will be irretrievably lost the scale and frequency of archaeological work has increased vastly at considerable cost to society consequently there is pressure to do the work efficiently and economically at the same time academic standards have to be maintained to assure that the end result will be the relevant knowledge about the past that

society pays for different countries have found different approaches and solutions to deal with this dilemma sometimes commercial archaeology is allowed sometimes it is not but in every national context quality has to be managed in some way this book presents a survey by specialists from the us canada and several european countries on how this is done what the principles are and also the priorities it will be useful for anyone interested in archaeological resource management

analyses of big datasets signal important directions for the archaeology of religion in the archaic to mississippian native north america across north america huge data accumulations derived from decades of cultural resource management studies combined with old museum collections provide archaeologists with unparalleled opportunities to explore new questions about the lives of ancient native peoples for many years the topics of technology economy and political organization have received the most research attention while ritual religion and symbolic expression have largely been ignored this was often the case because researchers considered such topics beyond reach of their methods and data in archaeology and ancient religion in the american midcontinent editors brad h koldehoff and timothy r pauketat and their contributors demonstrate that this notion is outdated through their analyses of a series of large datasets from the midcontinent ranging from tiny charred seeds to the cosmic alignments of mounds they consider new questions about the religious practices and lives of native peoples at the core of this volume are case studies that explore religious practices from the cahokia area and surrounding illinois uplands additional chapters explore these topics using data collected from sites and landscapes scattered along the mississippi and ohio river valleys this innovative work facilitates a greater appreciation for and understanding of ancient native religious practices especially their seamless connections to everyday life and livelihood the contributors do not advocate for a reduced emphasis on technology economy and political organization rather they recommend expanding the scope of such studies to include considerations of how religious practices shaped the locations of sites the character of artifacts and the content and arrangement of sites and features they also highlight analytical approaches that are applicable to archaeological datasets from across the americas and beyond

the practice of archaeology has many different facets from academia to government to cultural resource management to public media

considering the place of archaeology in society means understanding the role that archaeology has in the present day and a sense of the contributions that it can make in each of these areas both now and in the future archaeologists come to the field to pursue a variety of interests teaching examining history preserving the environment or studying a specialized time period or interest the outside world has a number of other expectations of archaeology preservation tourism and education to name but a few from a broad and varied background the editors have compiled a rare group of contributors uniquely qualified to address questions about the current state of archaeology and its relevance in society there is no single answer to the question of how the field of archaeology should develop and what it can do for society instead the authors in this volume lay out the many ways in which archaeology is relevant to the present day considering for example climate change energy exploration warfare national identity the importance of stories and how they are told and how and why opportunities to engage with the past through museums digs television classes and the print media have the form they currently do creating a state of the art tool for archaeologists policymakers and the public alike to understand the work of many in the field and address the challenges we all face
