additional costs or delay or which may warrant a significant change to the scope of the investigation enabling the niminisation of additional cost and or delay as well as potential for dispute minimising the incidence of disputes and resolving those that may arise in aspeedy and non confrontational manner on that basis that many archaeological contracts will fall within the provisions of part 2 of the housing grants construction and regeneration act 1996 this contract has been drafted to comply with the legislation with the intention that the various statutory schemes for construction contracts should not apply
